MISUNDERSTANDING ROUND DANCE CUES

FACE THE WALL, that's what the teacher would tell me when I went to the Country School. I looked to the right and I was FACE TO FACE with SUSIE Q so I started to FLIRT. I asked her if she wanted to CHANGE PLACES LEFT TO RIGHT, I had the better CHAIR. I said you CROSS IN FRONT and I'll CROSS BEHIND, that's when I noticed her CURLY WHIP held in place by a HAIRPIN. Soon she was my SWEETHEART, she made my heart light as a FEATHER, and I put a TWINKLE in her eye. We would STROLL along together, sometimes I would STRUT or SKIP or SWAGGER. One day as we were walking along the FENCELINE, she said she's a NEW YORKER, not yet SIXTEEN, and a RUNAWAY. And I was nothing but a DIP, only good enough to MOOCH from. At first all I could do was STUTTER, I tell you I was one CROSS BODY, I wanted to WHIP her with my LARIAT. But all I did was tell her to get her TRAVELING BOX, and her HORSE AND CART and RUN TO THE CAPE. Yea, let that horse CANTER!

My high school was next to the lake, so during the winter I could SKATE on the lake with my HOCKEY STICK. I would WHISK along doing some kind of SPIN MANEUVER like a SPIN TURN or a SPIRAL, but I never was good at the ROYAL SPIN. Most of all I could SLIP and SLIDE then GLIDE to a stop.

Later in life, I wanted to try Round Dancing. I tried to WING it, but I couldn't even do a BASIC TWO STEP. I took lessons and learned so much. Did you know that a FLICKER and a WOODPECKER are not always birds? Do you know why a FLEA HOPS? What is under your hood, a V6? ZIGZAG is not that little packet of papers you roll your VINE in and smoke under the WINDMILL. The FISHTAIL moves left and right and the WHALETAIL moves up and down. A THREE STEP is not a short ladder but THREE THREES still equal nine.

If you have a TRIPLE too often, you will get to the TIPSY POINT and the bartender will tell you to SCOOT and laugh as you SWAY and SWIVEL WALK to the SLIDING DOOR. If your car gets hits in the rear while in STOP AND GO traffic you could get WHIPLASH, so be careful when you are at the WHEEL. Don't drive in the left lane if other cars must make a RIGHTSIDE PASS, move to the right so they can make a LEFT SIDE PASS. When driving in the mountains, watch out for that FALLAWAY ROCK and if it is a YELLOW ROCK, it could be gold, but it's apt to be nothing but a BASIC ROCK.

SPANISH ARMS come in a BOX, sometimes a BROKEN BOX, from Spain – without firing pins which you PICKUP later.

Two dogs in a CHASE are having a CIRCLE CHASE or sometimes they will CHASE TO THE RIGHT or CHASE TO THE LEFT. It is hard to get a good TOP SPIN with a BIG TOP. A TRIPLE WHEEL could be a CHOPPER with a spare WHEEL in the SIDECAR POSITION, a BUTTERFLY SIDECAR wouldn't be big enough to hold the spare, but it could hold a SNAKE.

TWO TWOS (tutus) FORWARD for the BALLERINA WHEEL then BREAKAWAY for the ARGENTINE WALKS.

Look at the back of a DUCK, you will see a BACK FEATHER but not a CURVED FEATHER. Also notice the nice FEATHER FINISH by the WING.

Ten one hundred bills in a loop make a GRAND CIRCLE.

I went to the FIGURE 8 track in my convertible with the top down. You could say I had a FULL REVERSE TOP. I was trying to FOLLOW MY LEADER but when I got the "X", I made a DOUBLE REVERSE SPIN. Needless to say, I didn't get a CHECK that day.

Packing tape makes a good BOX FINISH before you put the STAMP on, and you can cut it with your SCISSORS.

Well, that's about all the SCOOP I have for now, so I'll WRAP this up, grab my TURKISH TOWEL with the LACE and take a DIP.


